



5010 NON-Charge Codes

If you are using any NON-Charge Codes for Insurance claims you will need to pass additional information along with your electronic claims.

- 1) If you are using "J" Injection codes for billing you will need to include the NDC number for each CHG Code. The format of the comment is:

NOC DrugName N412345678901 QT001 BMML

NOC – Constant

DrugName – up to **11 characters** of the drug name

N412345678901 – **N4** plus the **11** digit NDC number as documented below

QT001 – Quantity Number – 001 is the Quantity

BMML – Basis Measurement (**ML**-Milliliters) (**ME**-Milligrams) (**GR**-Grams) (**UN**-Units) (**F2**-International)

From our Utility Menu you can select the option "ECF Claim CHG Comments" option. then use the Non-CHG Code Wizard

- 2) Other non-injection non-CHG codes still need to be coded with the NOC trigger
For example: G4444 **NOC DEPRESSION SCREENING**

****NDC Codes General Information**

You can find the 11-digit NDC number printed on the drug package in a 5-4-2 format. The first five digits of the NDC identify the drug manufacturer, the next four identify the specific product and the last two identify the package size.

If the segments do not have the appropriate number of digits, you will need to add zeros at the beginning of the segment. For example, if the package number is 12345-123-12, you will need to add zeros at the beginning of the segments to reach the required number of digits for the 5-4-2 format (01234-0123-12). When entering the NDC number in the service-line, you will enter all 11 digits without hyphens (01234012312).
